
## Real Ale is a Star Performer

This year's Cask Report, an independent study of the beer market, has singled out cask ale, also known as real ale, as a star performer.

Pete Brown, author of the report and of 'Hops and Glory', a history of the original India Pale Ale, said 'Turnaround stories don't get much better than cask beer's. In a shrinking on-trade beer market, cask is the only category to show growth, albeit modest, of 1% in the first half of 2009.'

One explanation for this relative success is that real ale can only really be enjoyed in the pub, unlike most drinks that taste the same in or out of the home. Another factor that has contributed to the increasingly broad popularity of real ale is its star role in two new TV series – 'Oz and James Drink to Britain' and Neil Morrissey's 'Risky Business'. You would have to go back 19 years to find the previous national TV series featuring beer, Michael Jackson's 'Beer Hunter'.

Perhaps these programmes help to explain the doubling in the number of women who drink cask beer over the last year. Record breaking beer festivals, especially those linked to other events,



such as horse racing at Ascot have also contributed to the fact that around 400,000 people have tried cask beer for the first time in the last 12 months. Further encouraging statistics in the report, which is subtitled 'Helping British pubs beat the recession', point to the importance of well kept real ale in helping a pub to prosper, in an era when an average of 52 pubs a week have been closing.

Wetherspoon have always realised the importance of real ale sales to their overall 'offer'. Now other large managed pub companies are investing in cask throughout their estate.

A local example of this is the availability of two cask beers at the Robin Hood Toby Carvery in Newbury.

Real ale is also the star in a new website dedicated to the wonderful world of beer.

Award-winning Newbury writer Jeff Evans launched Inside Beer ([www.insidebeer.com](http://www.insidebeer.com)) at the Great American Beer Festival, held in Denver, Colorado, at the end of September.

'I'm very excited about Inside Beer' he said, 'It allows me to continue the work I've been doing for more than 20 years, which involves highlighting the very best beers and showcasing the people behind the world's most interesting breweries.' Jeff is confident that Inside Beer will prove valuable to both consumers and those involved in the trade.



## Good Beer Guide selection process

As often happens at this time of the year, after the latest edition of the Good Beer Guide has been launched, we are asked how entries are chosen for the Guide. Here is an outline of the selection process used by West Berkshire CAMRA together with details of how you can contribute.

A key point about the Good Beer Guide is that it is concerned with the quality of the beer that an establishment serves rather than the style of the place that serves it. This means that the bar of a club, hotel, station or theatre has just as much right to be in the guide as a traditional pub.

As the quality of the beer is fundamental, we recognise that the person who manages the bar/pub and the cellar manager are the most important people. This can be just one person, for example the landlord, or it might be a team. To this end, having consistency in this team is paramount. Should a premises change ownership, management or cellar management in the run up to a Good Beer Guide selection period, it is unlikely that we will be totally confident about the quality of the beer sold there for the next year. In such cases, we prefer to allow the new team time to settle in and show their commitment to cask ale. We can then consider them properly for the next edition.

The judging of the beer is done using the CAMRA National Beer Scoring System using a scale

of 0-5. Both CAMRA members and non-members can assist us in the selection process by registering their scores, throughout the year, using the survey form accessible from [www.westberks.camra.org.uk](http://www.westberks.camra.org.uk)

During January, beer scores are collated and various statistics are produced, including average score. The branch then has a meeting to discuss the establishments to go forward to a more manageable list. At this stage we include pubs that have been recommended to us throughout the year. The resulting list will then be cut again until we come down to a full survey stage shortlist. Once the surveys have been performed, we will have a final selection meeting to choose which of the shortlisted establishments will go forward as our entries for the Good Beer Guide. CAMRA members are welcome to take part in these selection meetings.

We are delighted when Ullage readers forward their own recommendations to us, and we make sure that these are all followed up. However, the number of entries within the guide is strictly limited and within West Berkshire we have about 150 establishments keen to be included.

Nominations can be e-mailed or sent by normal mail to us using the contact details published within Ullage. Please submit nominations and beer scores for the next guide by 7 Jan 2010.

■ The **Coach** pub and restaurant at Worlds End, Beedon opened on 23 October in the building that was previously the Coach and Horses. Greene King IPA, Old Speckled Hen and a guest ale will be available. [www.thecoachbeedon.com](http://www.thecoachbeedon.com)

■ Adrian and Susie, from the Bull at Barkham, have reopened the **Spring** (formerly Spring Inn) on the A4 near Sulhampstead. At the moment four handpumps are in use and a couple of lower strength beers such as Ascot Ales Alley Cat and Rebellion IPA will usually be available.

■ The **Lock, Stock and Barrel**, Newbury was the venue for the launch of the 2010 Good Beer Guide in September. Fuller's head brewer, John Keeling, announced the lucky winners of prizes that included a gallon of London Pride and boxed bottles of Fuller's 2005 Vintage Ale. There will be a Salsa night at the pub on 19 November with music from La Rianza.

■ The **Good Beer Guide 2010** lists 71 new breweries. Several new breweries have been setting up in our region. These include: Compass brewery in Oxford. [www.compassbrewery.com](http://www.compassbrewery.com); Loose Cannon brewery in Abingdon, with family connections to Laithwaites Wine; Two Bridges Brewery, a 2.5 barrel microbrewery just opened in Caversham. ■ The **West Berkshire Brewery** seasonal beers are: November – Alecost (4.3% ABV) a rich red bitter with a touch of citrus taste; December – Spika (4.4% ABV) a rich warming dark tawny beer. The brewery will also be bottling Christmas Magic (5.5% ABV) a dark ruby winter warmer.

■ The Kickers Bar at **Newbury Rugby Football Club** is now serving Good Old Boy and Mr Chubb's Lunchtime Bitter from West Berkshire Brewery.

■ The **Langley Hall Inn** at Worlds End, Beedon is now run by Ali Wright, formerly of the Bunk Inn at Curridge. Beers served include Good Old Boy and Brakspear Bitter (3.4% ABV). [www.langley-hall-inn.co.uk](http://www.langley-hall-inn.co.uk)

■ **Butts Brewery's** crisp and refreshing European style biere, Le Butts (5% ABV), is becoming their most popular non-core beer, with output almost equally split between cask and bottled.



■ The **3rd Ascot Racecourse Beer Festival**, on 25/26 September, featured beers from Cornwall and local breweries. Beer and cider sales showed substantial increases on 2008 figures with all of the cider and almost all of the beer being sold. The beer of the festival, as voted for by those attending, was Pitstop Brewery Sump (7% ABV).

■ Food is now available at **The Gun**, Wash Common. The dining area now has a Hollywood theme, featuring film posters and framed photographs. A good selection of real ales is available. Beer can be taken away in 4 pint containers.

■ The **Ibex**, Chaddleworth is holding a Winter Beer Festival from 14-20 December. [www.the-ibex.co.uk](http://www.the-ibex.co.uk)

■ A planning application to convert the **Beehive**, Upper Basildon into a residential dwelling has been rejected. The pub has now been closed for over a year.

## The Coopers Arms Newbury

The Coopers Arms is a traditional Arkell's pub, situated on the corner of Bartholomew Street and Craven Road, just to the south of Newbury town centre. David Reid has been the landlord for just over nine years and is helped by his wife Tiff, daughter Chari and barmaid Theresa.

David thinks there has been a public house here for some 300 years and that it was originally a coaching inn, as the two buildings in the rear car park are, in fact, old stables. The pub has a multi-room layout which cannot be altered much as the building is Grade II listed.

There is a community feel to the pub which has both darts and pool teams. Darts are played in the public bar (left, inside the front door). The pool table is in the lounge (ahead, from the front door) in a separate area, on the front right hand side, with dark wood panelling, a large stone fireplace and a beamed ceiling. The pub



also does meat raffles, bonus ball prize draw, Bingo (on Sunday nights) and has collection boxes for Help the Heroes and Air Ambulance.

The main public bar area is quite small, so that with a group of more than six at the bar it can seem quite crowded, although

the pub itself is actually quite large. At the moment, the only real ale the pub has on draught is Arkell's 3B. David is committed to real ale and looks forward to being able to put more beers on. When the demand is there, he would like to reintroduce Arkell's 2B, a good low alcohol beer, at just 3.2% ABV.

The pub has recently had extensive work completed on the leaking roof, which took longer than originally planned. When the scaffolding was in place, it could look like the pub was closed, which was not the case. Now, however, there is no excuse not to visit this friendly, community pub, near the centre of Newbury!

Tim Wale, of Tutts Clump Cider, took a party of 32 cider and beer enthusiasts on a 'Forest Foray' on Saturday 17 October, covering 171 miles and lasting 14 hours.

Roy Bailey planned and managed this excursion after the success of last October's cider trip to Gloucestershire. The first stop was the Red Shoot Inn at Linwood in the New Forest, reached by crossing a ford. Wadworth's head brewer, Brian Yorston, and trade quality brewer, Adrian Wood were there to welcome us and Brian gave small parties tours of the 2.5 barrel microbrewery, that is Red Shoot Inn brewer John Sherwood's domain. Brian explained that the brewery is identical to the test plant Pint Size brewery on their site at Devizes, where 6X is also brewed in their main brewery.

After lunch at the pub the coach party continued to New Forest Cider in Burley, with Tim taking care to avoid the stray New Forest ponies on the road. The open weekend event gave us a chance to see cider making as it was done in days gone by, when steam engines and belt drives were used to power apple crushers and presses. 
Pointers to look out for in a likely winner are links with local sports and games teams, charities and societies. The provision of any regular or special events or services by the pub would also be relevant.
